

GENERAL INFORMATION

Description of the 555e

The Better Packages 555e Series is water-activated tape dispenser (also known as a paper tape dispenser, gummed, or gum tape water-activated tape dispenser) and comes standard with a large capacity tape basket. The 555e series is designed for high volume shipping and packaging areas. This allows for up to a 1,000 ft. long or 10" diameter roll of tape (305 meter long or 254mm diameter roll).

The 555e is equipped with a heater unit, water tank, and high capacity water bottle, 64oz (1.89 liter).




Figure 1: Better Packages 555e

Definitions

Common terms that will be used throughout this manual.

WAT – IPG Brand Water Activated Tape

User/Operator - The individual who has been trained on the daily use of the Machine System

Maintenance Champion – The individual(s) who work for the end user of the Machine System who are responsible for conducting general and preventative maintenance

IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

There are a number of safety labels used on the 555e. These labels are placed at different locations on the dispenser to warn operators and service personnel of possible dangers. Please read the labels on the machine and the following safety precautions before using the machine.

Read this manual for other important safety operating and service information.

Only trained personnel are to operate machine.

Only fully qualified technicians are to service this machine.

Wear safety glasses when performing maintenance.

Allow time to cool before working on the heaters.

Disconnect electrical power before servicing.

Follow Lock Out / Tag Out Procedures BEFORE servicing any machinery.

All factory installed covers and guards must be in place before operating.

Stay clear of moving parts which can shear and cut.

Should any of the safety labels on the dispenser be damaged or destroyed, replacements can be ordered through your distributor.




Figure 2: Label Placement

LABEL DESCRIPTIONS

The label shown is affixed to the heaters.

It warns operators and service personnel to keep their hands clear of hot elements. Allow time to cool, minimum of 30 minutes, prior to servicing.




Figure 5: Tape Loading Decal (Gum Side In)




Figure 8: Machine Nameplate

Operator Skill Level Descriptions

These descriptions and levels are uniform across all Better Packages WAT Dispensers

Skill "A" Dispenser Operator

This operator is trained to use the Dispenser with the machine controls, to change tape, and to clear jams and perform basic troubleshooting.

Important: The end user area supervisor must ensure that the operator has been properly trained on all machine functions before operating the machine.

Skill "B" Mechanical Maintenance Technician

Also referred to as the Maintenance Champion, this technician, is trained to use the Dispenser as the Operator and to check and adjust mechanical components, to perform maintenance operations and repair the Dispenser. A skill "B" operator is not allowed to work on live electrical components.

Skill "C" Factory Trained Technician

A Skill "C" technician is trained by IPG and may perform extraordinary maintenance. This includes electrical components.




Figure 9: Dispenser Dimensions




Figure 10: 555e Components

Operating Conditions

Use in a dry, relatively clean environment at 40° to 105° F (5° to 40° C). Humidity not to exceed 90% at a temperature of 68° F (20° C). The 555e will be capable of operating correctly at altitudes up to 10,000 ft. (3,000 m) above sea level.

Tape Requirements

Use only IPG Brand Water Activated Tape.

Maximum tape roll diameter of 10" (254mm) with a maximum tape roll length of 1000ft (304.8m).

Tape Length

The 555e comes standard to be able to dispense tape lengths from 6in to 45in (eS, eSA, and eFA), 12in to 90in (eL), 15cm to 145cm (eM, eMA, eJ, eJA, and eFACM) there is a standard tolerance of +/- ½" (6mm).

^{**}eFA and eFACM models use gum side in tape.

Unpacking

After opening all the top flaps on the carton, you will find instructions for properly removing the dispenser and its included materials. It is recommended to keep all packing materials in case you need to ship the dispenser later or wish to pack and store it.

Adjusting the Roll Guides

Roll guides fit into the slots in the front and bottom panels of the tape basket. They hold the tape roll vertical and centered on the feed wheel. These are adjusted for the width of the tape being used. The 555e has two (2) roll guides.




Figure 12: Roll Guides

Installing the Roll Guides

Installing the Roll Guides in the tape basket is simple and easy.




Figure 13: Roll Guide Install 1

- 1. Open the lid.
- 2. Take one of the roll guides and angle it slightly so the tab on the long side slips into one of the vertical slots on the forward side of the tape basket.




Figure 14: Roll Guide Install 2

- 3. When the tab is inserted into the slot pull it all the way up to allow the lower tab to be inserted into the slot.
- 4. This will allow the bottom tab to drop into the corresponding slot in the bottom of the tape basket.
- 5. Repeat this process for the second roll guide.




Figure 15: Roll Guides Install 3

6. Optional: If you wish to lock the guides in place where they cannot be unintentionally removed. To do this take a small cable tie and from the underside of the machine feed it through the hole in the roll guide and secure it around the tab. The added width of the cable tie will keep the guides in place.

The 555e is capable of dispensing IPG manufactured water activated tape in widths of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 3" wide.

Loading the Tape Gum Side In

The loading procedure is for eS, eL, eSA, eFA, eFACM, eJ, and eJA

- 1. Open the lid.
- 2. Using scissors cut the end of the tape so it is a square clean cut.
- 3. Place the roll in the tape basket so that:
 - The roll is vertical.
 - The cut end comes from under the roll and over the back.
- 4. Feed the tape over the Lift Roller and then over the Black Roller.
- 5. Slip the tape under the upper tape plate and under the feed wheel. The tape should rest up to the blade.
- 6. Close the lid.




Figure 16: Gum Side In Tape Path

Loading the Tape Gum Side Out

The loading procedure is for eM and eMA

- 1. Open the lid.
- 2. Using scissors cut the end of the tape so it is a square clean cut.
- 3. Place the roll in the tape basket so that:
 - The roll is vertical.
 - The cut end comes from under the roll and up the front of the tape basket.
- 4. Feed the tape over the Black Roller.
- 5. Slip the tape under the upper tape plate and under the feed wheel. The tape should rest up to the blade.
- 6. Close the lid.




Figure 17: Gum Side Out Tape Path

Checking the Upper Tape Plate

Verify the upper tape plate is completely installed and in the proper position. If the tape plate is not in proper position remove it by grasping the bent upper portion and sliding it out toward the rear of the Dispenser. Verify the tape path is clean and dry before sliding the upper tape plate back into position. It should rest under the guide bar near the blade and be seated around the feed wheel.




Figure 18: Upper Tape Plate

The Upper Tape Plate is vital for the correct functionality of the Dispenser. If the plate is not in position or is missing the tape will jam.

Installing the Brushes and Water Tank

To install the brush:

- 1. Orient the brush in the proper direction with the shortest bristles closest to the Dispenser.
- 2. Place the brush in the opening allowing it rest against the Retaining Bracket.
- 3. Press down on the brush so that the Retaining Bracket applies pressure to side of the base of the Brush.
- 4. The brush is properly installed when the bristles are flat across the top of the tank.

Water level can be adjusted with a slider on the right side of the water tank. Moving it closer to the machine will increase the level of water.




Figure 19: Brush Install

Water Tank Install



CAUTION: UNDER NORMAL OPERATIONAL CONDITIONS THE BOTTOM OF THE HEATER WILL BE HOT. HANDLE THE HEATER ONLY USING THE TABS ON EITHER SIDE OF THE HEATER OR ALLOW TIME FOR THEM TO FULLY COOL BEFORE HANDLING.

- 1. Grip the tank from end opposite of the brushes.
- 2. Angle the assembled tank back slightly to allow the brushes to slip under the heaters.
 - If necessary the heater can be lifted by the tabs on either side of the heater to allow for easier install.
- 3. Lift up slightly and tilt the bottom of the tank into the machine. The base of the tank has a small lip around it locking the tank on the tank shelf.
- 4. Give the tank a slight nudge back and forth to verify it is fully seated on the shelf.

Water level can be adjusted with a slider on the right side of the water tank. Moving it closer to the machine will increase the level of water.




Figure 20: Water Tank Install

Water Bottle Install

The 555e series machines all use the same 64oz (1.8 liter) water bottle. Unscrew the cap and fill it with room temperature water for best results. There is no need for any special water such as distilled water. In the event your facility has hard water or water with a higher than normal mineral count you may want to consider using filtered water.

After filling the water bottle tighten the cap, the membrane will seal the bottle. Place the bottle on shelf, the bottle has an indent to allow the water bottle retainer to keep it in place. The cap should rest around the post in the water tank allowing water to flow freely into the tank. Once the water in the tank has reached the same height as the bottle cap the water will create a seal and stop the flow.





Figure 21: Water Bottle Install

Connecting Power and Utilities

The 555e series machines come equipped with a three (3) pin power socket that is capable of accepting a variety of power cords for use around the world. The Dispenser is also equipped with a 9 pin communication port* and a fuse holder.



Models of the 555e are manufactured for world wide use. See the Technical Specifications section for which model is rated for your power requirements. To connect the Dispenser to power first verify the main power switch is in the Off [O] position, then insert the female end of the cord into the A/C Power Socket, then insert the male end into a properly grounded power outlet, lastly flip the main power switch to the On [I] position. The machine will beep when fully booted.

Only replace the fuse with a 4A 5 x 20mm supplied by Better Packages.

eS, eL, eSA, eFA, eFACM, eJ, and eJA, Replacement part number <u>ST2341K</u>.

eM and eMA Replacement part number <u>ST2490</u>.

* Depending on the model the 9 pin communication port can only be used for a foot switch (eS). On automatic models (eSA, eMA, eJA, and eFACM) the 9 pin RS-232 communication port can be used with optional equipment such as a foot switch or the Automatic Measuring Device (AMD-1). This port can also be used to issue commands via an external computer. Always power down the machine before connecting any communication cable.

Setting and Adjusting Temperature




Figure 23: 555e Heater

The 555e series machines use the same heater unit. The heater is adjustable through a knob on the top of unit. It is marked with an OFF, MAX, and five (5) dot marked segments to allow for easy setting. The Dispenser is shipped with the heater in the OFF [O] position.

Rotate the dial to the desired the heat setting. The heater setting is dependent on the environment the Dispenser is in. If the Dispenser is in a climate controlled space the heater will not need to set higher than 50%. This will help extend the life of the heater.

In some models the heaters have a limiting device preventing the operator from turning the heat past a certain point. These are retrofit-able to all 555e series machines. Should you have the need for a limited heater please contact Better Packages Customer Service.

Mount to Work Bench (Optional)

The 555e series machines may be bolted to the work bench or table it sits on. This is to prevent the Dispenser from being knocked off of the work surface should it, or the surface, be bumped into. This will help prevent potentially serious damage to the Dispenser or injury to personnel. The Dispenser is shipped with four (4) rubber feet attached to the bottom with 10-24 Phillips head screws.

- 1. Drill four holes into the top of the bench or table.
- 2. Remove the four (4) screws that secure the feet to the bottom of the Dispenser.
- 3. Measure the thickness of the bench or table. Obtain four (4) 10-24 threaded screws or bolts that are 9/16 to 1-1/16 inches longer than the thickness of the surface.
- 4. Position the Dispenser so the holes in the surface are aligned with the feet of the Dispenser, keep the rubber feet in place when positioning the Dispenser.
- 5. Insert the 10-24 screws or bolts through the bottom of the bench or table, through the rubber feet, and into the threaded portion of the bottom panel of the Dispenser.
 - Use a thread locking compound to prevent the screws or bolts from coming loose during normal operation.
 - Use a fender washer between the bottom of the bench or table and mounting screw for additional surface area contact.
 - Tighten the screws so they are snug but are not compressing the rubber feet of the Dispenser.




Figure 24: Mounting Dispenser to Surface

General Operating Procedures

Verify the Dispenser is plugged into a properly grounded outlet. If the power cord is not connected to the Dispenser verify the main power switch is in the off position before connecting the cord to the rear of the Dispenser prior to plugging it into an outlet. See the section titled <u>Connecting Power and Utilities</u> for more details.

Verify tape is loaded correctly. If no tape is loaded see the section titled Loading the Tape for more details.

- 1. Flip the main power switch. After the machine successfully boots you will hear an audible beep giving the operator an audible alert that the machine is ready for use.
- 2. Adjust the heaters to the desired setting.
- 3. Select the desired output on the keypad.

Selecting the Length of Tape



The Dispenser allows for lengths of tape ranging from a minimum of 4 inches (102mm) to a maximum of 120 inches (3048mm) in increments of 1/2 inch (13mm).

The 555e keypad has two columns of numbered buttons, length adjustment controls near the top, and repeat button(s) at the bottom. Automatic models will have an automatic mode button and indicator light at the top of the keypad and a Repeat 2 key at the bottom.

The top of the keypad contains a "+" and a "-" button. The "+" button will add 1/2 inch (13mm) to the length selected on the keypad. The "-" button will subtract 1/2 inch (13mm) from the length selected on the keypad. The "2x" button will double the selected length on the keypad.

Depending on the model of machine the buttons below the length options will vary.

Automatic Models:

On automatic models there will be three (3) buttons: Repeat/Start, Repeat 2/Enter, and Random. In normal operation mode the Repeat/Start button will repeat the last dispensed length of tape. In normal operation mode the Repeat 2/Enter button will repeat the second to last length of tape dispensed. In Automatic Mode the Repeat/Start button will begin the operator entered program. In Automatic Mode the Repeat 2/Enter button will store the selected length. The Random button will dispense tape for as long as the operator holds down the button.

See Programming the Automatic 555e for detailed operation instructions.

Standard Models:

On Standard models there will be two (2) buttons: Repeat/Start, and Random. The Repeat/Start button will repeat the last dispensed length of tape. The Random button will dispense tape for as long as the operator holds down the button.

Advanced Adjustment of a Number on the Keypad

The below examples will use the operation samples from the 555eS but will apply to any model of 555e, including those of a custom keypad.

to dispense 49.5 inches

The dispenser is capable of making advanced adjustments of selectable options on the keypad. In the above example the selected length is doubled and then 1.5 (38mm) inches is added to the doubled amount.

Programing the Automatic 555e

The automatic models of the 555e (555eSA, 555eMA, 555eFA, and 555eJA) allow an operator to program in a basic set of lengths, up to 3. This allows for operators to efficiently seal known patterns of cartons or a more complex seal, such as an H pattern.

Automatic Mode will dispense the programmed lengths. When the operator removes the tape from the dispense it will automatically dispense the next length in the sequence. Sequences can be as little as a single length or up to three (3) unique lengths. This includes alterations using the "+" or "-" or "2x" or Random keys.

Programming the Automatic 555e machines is simple and easy:

Activate Automatic Mode

To activate the Automatic Mode press the "A" button at the top of the keypad. An audible beep will sound and the indicator light next to the "A" button will be illuminated red.

Programming a Single Length

Once Automatic Mode has been activated follow the below instructions to program a single length.

The below examples will use the operation samples from the 555eSA but will apply to any automatic model of 555e, including those of a custom keypad.

Press 24 ... a 24 inch piece of tape will be dispensed. Remove the tape and apply it to the carton.

Press REPEAT 2 ENTER this will store the length to memory.

Press REPEAT this will start the recorded program.

Once started the dispenser will automatically dispense a 24 inch piece of tape. When the operator removes the tape the 555e will automatically dispense the next 24 inch strip of tape.

Programming Two Lengths

Once Automatic Mode has been activated follow the below instructions to program a single length.

The below examples will use the operation samples from the 555eSA but will apply to any automatic model of 555e, including those of a custom keypad.

Press 24 ... a 24 inch piece of tape will be dispensed. Remove the tape and apply it to the carton.

Press REPEAT 2 this will store the length to memory.

Press **6** ... a 6 inch piece of tape will be dispensed. Remove the tape and apply it to the carton.

Press REPEAT 2 this will store the length to memory.

Press (REPEAT START) this will start the recorded program.

Once started the dispenser will automatically dispense a 24 inch piece of tape. When the operator removes the tape the 555e will automatically a 6 inch strip of tape. Once the last strip of the sequence has been removed the program will start over and automatically dispense a 24 inch piece of tape.

Programming Three Lengths

Once Automatic Mode has been activated follow the below instructions to program a single length.

The below examples will use the operation samples from the 555eSA but will apply to any automatic model of 555e, including those of a custom keypad.

Press 24 ... a 24 inch piece of tape will be dispensed. Remove the tape and apply it to the carton.

Press ENTER this will store the length to memory.

Press (6)... a 6 inch piece of tape will be dispensed. Remove the tape and apply it to the carton.

Press this will store the length to memory.

Press 12 ... a 12 inch piece of tape will be dispensed. Remove the tape and apply it to the carton.

Press ENTER this will store the length to memory.

 $\mathsf{Press}\left(\frac{\mathsf{REPEAT}}{\mathsf{start}}\right) \mathsf{this} \mathsf{ will} \mathsf{ start} \mathsf{ the} \mathsf{ recorded} \mathsf{ program}.$

Once started the dispenser will automatically dispense a 24 inch piece of tape. When the operator removes the tape the 555e will automatically a 6 inch strip of tape. When the second length is removed the 555e will dispense a 12 inch strip of tape. Once the last strip of the sequence has been removed the program will start over and automatically dispense a 24 inch piece of tape.

Turning Off Automatic Mode

There are two (2) methods to turn off Automatic Mode. The first is to press the "A" button to return to standard operation. The second option is to turn off the dispenser. Turning off the dispenser and/or pressing the "A" button will clear the memory of the stored operator installed program.

Practical Use of the Automatic Mode

A common use of Automatic Mode is applying tape in a "H" pattern to a box. The "H" pattern of taping a box is a method commonly used to reinforce the seams and edges of the box for added strength and stability. This is usually applied on cases for long term storage, heavy or fragile items, and international shipping where cartons tend to be processed through several hand off points.

Programming an "H" Pattern

Once Automatic Mode has been activated follow the below instructions to program a single length.

The below examples will use the operation samples from the 555eSA but will apply to any automatic model of 555e, including those of a custom keypad.

Press 24 ... a 24 inch piece of tape will be dispensed. Remove the tape and apply it to the carton.

Press 6 ... a 6 inch piece of tape will be dispensed. Remove the tape and apply it to the carton.

Press 6 ... a 6 inch piece of tape will be dispensed. Remove the tape and apply it to the carton.

Press ENTER this will store the length to memory.

Press 6 ... a 6 inch piece of tape will be dispensed. Remove the tape and apply it to the carton.

Press ENTER this will store the length to memory.

Press REPEAT this will start the recorded program.

Once started the dispenser will automatically dispense a 24 inch piece of tape. When the operator removes the tape the 555e

will automatically a 6 inch strip of tape. When the second length is removed the 555e will dispense a 6 inch strip of tape. Once the last strip of the sequence has been removed the program will start over and automatically dispense a 24 inch piece of tape.

The "H" pattern of taping is a versatile method that can be applied in various situations where secure packaging is essential to protect the contents of the carton during handling, shipping, or storage.




Figure 26: "H" Pattern

APPLYING TAPE TO A CARTON

Choosing the Correct Tape Type

TYPE	CHARACTERISTIC
Paper Tape or Kraft Paper Tape	Made from paper only, with no additional reinforcing material
Reinforced Tape or Reinforced Paper Tape	Made from paper and contains additional strands of reinforcing material, typically fiberglass

IPG offers a variety of different grades of <u>Paper Tape or Kraft Paper Tape</u>. In most circumstances this non-reinforced tape is good for smaller and lighter cartons.

IPG offers a variety of different grades of Reinforced Tape or Reinforced Paper Tape. In most circumstances this reinforced tape is good for larger boxes and those with increased weight.

Contact your Authorized IPG Representative for the best tape for your applications.

Choosing the Correct Tape Length

In most situations it is recommended to dispense a length of tape that is equal to the length of seam on the carton with an additional 4-6 inches (101-152mm) to allow for tape legs on either end of the carton.

In the event the carton is extremely long an additional 6-8 inches (101-203mm) is recommended for tape legs.

In the event the carton is short an additional 3-4 inches (76-101mm) is may be used.

Proper Tape Moistening

Dispense a piece of tape and examine the adhesive surface. The tape should:

- Be evenly wet
- Have no dry spots
- Have no spots where water is running off the surface.

Rub the wet adhesive with your finger.

- The adhesive should have an "oily" feel and consistency.
- You should be able to move the adhesive underneath your finger.

When you rub two wet adhesive surfaces of the tape together against each other, you should see "strings" of adhesive stretching between the two surfaces as you pull them apart, looking much like taffy as it is pulled.

If the tape is too wet or watery, it:

- Will not set fast enough
- May slip slightly over the surface of the carton, causing a "loose" seal If the tape is not wet enough, it:
- May be tacky or sticky like pressure sensitive tape, but not "oily" like properly moistened tape.
- Is too dry to properly activate the adhesive which will prevent a permanent bond from forming (because the adhesive cannot penetrate the corrugate fibers).
- May too easily pull off the carton during handling and transportation.

APPLYING TAPE TO A CARTON

Sealing the Carton

The best way to apply the tape to the carton is:

- 1. Place the wet tape on the end of one of the flaps to be sealed so that:
 - Half of the tape's width is on one flap
 - The other half is overhanging
- 2. Fold the flap without the tape down to its closed position.
- 3. Fold the other carton flap (the one with the overhanging tape) down into its proper closed position so that the overhanging portion of the tape is now in contact with the other flap on the opposite side of the carton.
- 4. Starting from the middle of the carton, apply a light downward pressure and wipe your hands over the tape on top of the carton flaps. Move from the center to the sides and then down over the overlapping ends in the sides of the carton. Sometimes wiping the tape down a second time before releasing the carton is helpful




Figure 27: Applying Tape

Common Tape Patterns

The following are commonly used tape patterns. "H" pattern or sometimes referred to as the "I" pattern is when the center seam is sealed as normal and two more strips of tape are applied to seal the sides of the minor flaps. This allows for a secure and aesthetically pleasing carton. The "Belly Band" is when a strip of tape is placed in the opposite direction of the center seam. This helps secure heavier loads and is applied to the top and bottom of the box. The "X" pattern is more rarely used but is considered the most secure and is a cross between the "H" pattern and the "Belly Band." It is used for extremely heavy items.




Figure 28: "H" Pattern

PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE

Suggested Preventative Maintenance Schedule



WARNING: TURN OFF ELECTRICAL POWER SUPPLY BEFORE PERFORMING MAINTENANCE. THE CUT-OFF BLADE IS EXTREMELY SHARP USE CUT RESISTANT GLOVES WHEN SERVICING OR REPLACING THE BLADE. THE HEATER WILL BE HOT. ALLOW TIME TO COOL PRIOR TO SERVICING.

Weekly

- Wash brushes with mild soap and water. Rinse well to remove all soap residue.
- Clean any accumulated dust with a dry brush or blower.
- Wash water tank with mild soap and water. Rinse well to remove all soap residue.

Monthly

- Clean accumulated glue from blades using a scraper. Do not scrape the cutting edge of the blade this can cause damage and may result in needing to change the blade.
- Apply a light coating of a light machine oil to the back of the blade.
- Add only a few drop of a light machine oil to felt pads.

Annually

- Thoroughly clean all accumulated pieces of tape, dust, and any other foreign material from inside the Dispenser with a dry brush or blower.
- Clean the bottom of heaters and pressure plates of accumulated tape adhesive.
- Clean all covers with a damp rag.

Washing the Tank, Brush, and Bottle

Water Brush: Glue from the tape may accumulate and reduce the effectiveness of the moistening system. Wash brushes weekly with mild soap. Be sure to agitate the bristles while in the soap and water solution. A brush is considered clean after this agitation and all adhesive build up has been removed.

It is recommended to soak brushes in a solution of mild soap and water overnight. This will reduce any adhesive build up and extend the life of the brushes.

If you operate multiple machines all brushes may soak in the same container.

Rinse the brushes in running warm water before reinstalling them into a clean water tank.




Figure 31: Brush Cleaning

Water Tank: Glue from the tape may accumulate in the water tank. This build up can accumulate in the water brushes and result in a reduction of water transmission to the tape and a weaker bond to the carton.

It is recommended to wash the water tank once a week in a warm soap and water solution. Use a low-scratch abrasive brush to clean the bottom of the water tank as well as the tight areas. Rinse the water tank in running warm water before reinstalling.

Water Bottle: Hard water build up may appear in the water bottles over time. If you have hard water or other mineral rich water it is recommended to use a filtered water to extend the life of the water brush as well as the seal in the water bottle cap.

It is recommended to wash out the water bottle once a week with a warm soap and water solution. Fill the bottle $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ with the soap and water solution. Secure the water bottle cap, then shake the bottle vigorously. Allow the bottle to drain before rinsing with warm water. Allow the water bottle to fully dry before reusing.

In extreme circumstances the water bottle may be cleaned with a white vinegar and water solution but it would be recommended to replace the water bottle and its cap.

The adhesive is non-toxic and water soluble. If adhesive builds up on an operator's hands, washing with soap and water will remove any debris. Standard packing gloves or other required PPE should be used in accordance with plant policies where the dispenser is being operated in.

TROUBLESHOOTING

PROBLEM	POSSIBLE CAUSES	SOLUTIONS
Tape is too short	Feed wheel is out of adjustment	Conduct a feed wheel check and adjustment.
Tape is too long Keyp	Damaged encoder wheel	Remove left side cover and verify the integrity of the encoder wheel.
	Keypad connector is not connected properly	Remove the left side cover and verify the data ribbons are connected to all pins. If the keypad is shifted it will still function but keys will no longer work as desired.
	Dispenser is unplugged	Verify the power cord is connected to the Dispenser and a properly functioning grounded outlet.
	Dispenser is off	Flip the main power witch to the ON position.
Dispenser not outputting tape	Safety interlock system is interrupted	Verify the lid(s) of the Dispenser are closed. Verify the magnet in the left side of the lid(s) is in place. Verify the lid is properly closed and not skewed.
	Fuse is blown	Replace the main fuse. Use a fuse rated at AL T2 250V. For eSA, eJA, eL, eS use <u>ST2341K</u> For eFA, eMA use <u>ST-2490</u>
	Keypad is disconnected	Remove the left side cover and verify the data ribbons are connected to all pins.
l l	Main Board is damaged	Verify the Dispenser is connected to a working outlet and plugged in, flip the main power switch to the ON position, the Dispenser should have an audible beep. If there is no beep the Main Board will need replacement.
Poor tape wetting	Low water level	Adjust the height of the Water Bottle using the slider on the Water Tank.
	Dirty application brushes	Soak the brushes in warm water and clean with mild soap.
	Tape is not making contact with the brushes	Verify the heater is properly mounted and not damaged.
	Water Bottle empty	Refill the Water Bottle
